
High School Students

Physical therapists or PTs are:

- Licensed doctors
- Movement experts that reduce pain by diagnosing and treating movement dysfunctions
- They maintain, restore, and improve the body's ability to move and perform functional activities.


In many cases, this occurs without expensive surgery and it often reduces the need for long-term use of prescription medications.

Physical Therapy Assistants or PTAs:

- Work directly under the supervision of licensed PT
- NOT a physical therapy aide
- Will not be able to diagnose or discharge a patient
- Allowed to treat and progress a patient's plan of care (collaborate with the PT as necessary)

- Similar to PTA, but in an OT setting
